
At Wingello, we want to offer Simply Good Food. We have done the sums and know we provide better value. You can also judge the taste difference.

In the accompanying chart you can see that our Beer Batter chips - large and small serves - are better value for more food. We also make home-made chips using Robertson potatoes (when available) using the traditional "thrice fried" method.

As to the Wingello Burger with the lot ... it is a great meal in itself and is better value too.

Many suggest that burgers are "junk food". But our burgers have 100% beef patties, locally baked buns with no preservatives, locally supplied bacon, free-range eggs and fresh lettuce, tomato, onion and beetroot



making for a meal on a nice bun.

An additional benefit to purchasing from the Wingello Village store is that you are supporting local businesses and families. All the staff live nearby and the majority of our supplies are sourced from the district.

Our Angus burgers are pasture fed from Wingello farms.




Bocce in the Backyard - and Wingello Pizza too!


