A huge Wingello community effort helped the riders on their way

Over 1,200 bicycle riders took part in the Highland Fling on Sunday 10th November.

About 750 did the half fling whereby they rode from Bundanoon to Wingello and returned. About 480 did the Full Fling which meant they rode from Bundanoon to Wingello, around the Wingello Forest tracks and then back to Bundanoon - about 100km in total.

And 32 brave souls participated in the 100 mile event which meant the Full Fling plus another trip around the Wingello Forest tracks for fun.

This year the weather was misty, cloudy and raining with a heavy rain finishing off the day.

The Wingello Rural Fire Brigade was responsible for all the marshalling, traffic control and radio communication systems for when the ride went through Wingello and the State Forest. Many locals volunteered to assist the brigade, boosting the numbers so all the various positions could be covered. Some volunteers were in town whilst others were flung to points all along the Wingello forest track.

Meanwhile, the Wingello Public School were assisting riders at the half way pint at the oval, providing food and drinks.
