

Science Today: The Best Way to Hold a Burger



The Japanese television show Honma Dekka!? wanted to find out the best way to hold a burger without the fillings falling out. They tasked 3 researchers—with expertise in fluid mechanics, engineering, and

dentistry — with figuring out the very best way to hold a burger.

Wingello Fire Brigade News

August has certainly been a wet month and we can now be sure that the drought has broken in Wingello. In just over two weeks we have received over 330mm of rain and it is still hanging around. A Hazard Reduction was scheduled to be done on and around Freestone Tower, near Paddy's River, on the first weekend of the big rains. However this needed to be cancelled. The Brigade did participate in a HR at Buxton prior to the big wet. This was done over a few days and thanks to the guys that attended. Another HR was carried out in the Starlight Ave area in Wingello again before the wet and it was reasonably successful. Hope we did not inconvenience residents too much with the smoke.

The brigade attended three callouts during August but all were not serious. Two fire calls and then an MVA in the north bound lane just north of Paddy's River bridge. No injuries in the MVA and no property damage to the two fire calls. All calls were done in wet and adverse conditions, well done guys and girls.

OK serious stuff now. **The Brigade's open day will be held at the Station on the 13th of September**, as advertised there will be a jumping castle and face painter for the kids with a BBQ for all. So come down and meet your crew members, talk to them about your Bush Fire Survival Plans and also protection of your property if needed. Checkout our station and what we
